Luke 10:30-37

V30 “then Jesus replied and said, ‘a certain man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho; and he fell among robbers, and they stripped him and beat him and went off leaving him half dead,

V31 and by chance a certain priest was going down on that road, and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side.

V32 and likewise a Levite also, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side.

V33 but a certain Samaritan who was on a journey, came upon him; and when he saw him, he felt compassion.

V34 and came to him, and bandaged up his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them; and he put him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn, and took care of him.

V35 and on the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper and said, ‘take care of him; and whatever more you spend, when I return, I will repay you.’
